For summer, choose light, pastel, and neutral makeup shades to get that sun-kissed look. Go for natural tones and apply lightly. You want to look natural, not overly made up.

Shape your brows by plucking or threading. It's the ultimate secret to a brighter face. With clean eyebrows, you can make do with very little makeup!

Experiment with your hair. Summer is the time to try out bangs and layers for more volume. Since the sun

tends to dry out hair, make sure you get your hair trimmed regularly to avoid split ends.

You can also get your hair relaxed at a reputable salon.



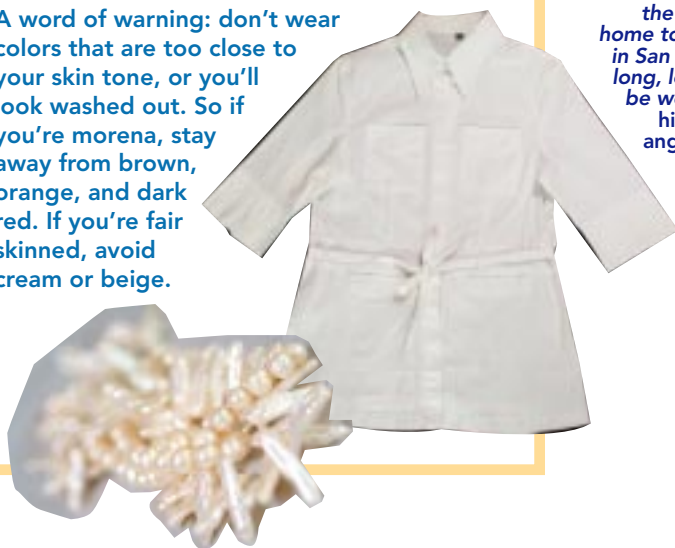
TIPS FROM THE PROS

Hunt around in your closet for a T-shirt, sleeveless blouse, or collared shirt and you're all set. Accessorize with bright colors, like orange, yellow, bright blue or bright pink. Try on chunky jewelry or bags in bold, fun colors.

Of course, you shouldn't limit yourself to white. But if you do wear colored clothing, accessorize with white and you'll still be a refreshing sight.
